Exhibitors who participated in the 2023 meeting had the opportunity to select exhibit space for the 2024 meetings during the 2023 event. The AAHS, ASPN and ASRM uses a priority point system to assign each exhibiting company a priority exhibit space selection number. Your exhibit space selection number is based on your company's history of exhibit participation in the Joint Annual Meetings beginning in 2008, good standing in all three organizations, and the number of exhibit space units contracted since 2008. The priority point system consists of three (3) points provided annually (since 2008) for the first exhibit space contracted, and one (1) point for each additional exhibit space or unit contracted. Companies that have merged do not receive a total of the combined points of the companies that have merged, but rather the points of the company that has the most accumulated points.

After space selection has occurred remaining space assignmenst will be given to companies in the order of their priority number or in the order in which applications are received. Following the October 6, 2023 deadline, exhibit assignments will be based upon availability. If space is filled by October 6, 2023, applications received will be placed on a waiting list and notified immediately. Exhibitors wishing to avoid assignment of space adjacent to a particular company must indicate this on their application. Careful consideration will be given to such requests.

Installation**

AAHS, ASPN and ASRM, and their authorized representatives are hereinafter referred to as

 $\textbf{1. PAYMENT AND REFUNDS}. \ \textbf{Applications submitted prior to October 6, 2023 must have } 50\%$ payment once the confirmation is sent to you. The balance of the space rental charge will become due and payable on October 6, 2023. Applications submitted after October 6, 2023 must be accompanied by payment IN FULL once confirmation is sent to you.

If Show Management receives a written request for cancellation or downgrade of space on or before October 6, 2023, the exhibitor will be liable for a 25% processing fee. For cancellations or downgrades received after October 6, 2023, no refunds will be issued.

It is expressly agreed by the exhibitor that in the event he/she fails to pay the space rental at the times specified, or fails to comply with any other provisions contained in these rules and regulations concerning use of exhibit space, Show Management shall have the right to reassign the booth location shown on the face of the contract or to take possession of said space and lease same, or any part thereof, to such parties and upon such terms and conditions as it may deem proper. In the event of a default by the exhibitor, as set forth in the previous sentence, the exhibitor shall forfeit as liquidated damages, the amount paid for their space reservation, regardless of whether or not Show Management enters into a further lease for the space involved.

2. SPACE RENTAL AND ASSIGNMENT OF LOCATION. Whenever possible, space assignments will be made by Show Management in keeping with the preferences as to location requested by the exhibitor. SHOW MANAGEMENT, HOWEVER, RESERVES THE RIGHT TO MAKE THE FINAL DETERMINATION OF ALL SPACE ASSIGNMENTS IN THE BEST INTERESTS OF THE EXPOSITION.

No firm or organization not assigned exhibit space will be permitted to solicit business within the Exhibit Areas.

- 4. EXHIBITOR'S AUTHORIZED REPRESENTATIVE. Each exhibitor must name one person to be the representative in connection with installation, operation and removal of the firm's exhibit. Such representative shall be authorized to enter into such service contracts as may be necessary and for which the exhibitor shall be responsible. The exhibitor shall assume responsibility for such representative being in attendance throughout all exposition periods; and this representative shall be responsible for keeping the exhibit neat, manned and orderly at all times. For their own safety and protection, children sixteen (16) years of age and under will not be admitted to the exhibit halls at any time unless they have written permission from Show Management.
- 5. INSTALLATION AND REMOVAL. Show Management reserves the right to fix the time for the installation of a booth prior to the Show opening and for its removal after the conclusion of the Show.
